

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Dear VGA Family and Friends Debbie Tetter

t this time of year, I always feel like a runner on a track that has completed that first lap; what matters most is that next mile. Here we are. Will it be 2022 or 2020-two? That joke might grow old fast but it is certainly relevant. It's not that funny, either.

In my last letter, I mentioned that new signage was in place. I am writing this during the holiday shutdown, traditionally refurbishment time at the gallery. During our down time, I prepped the Red Wall for its next incarnation and learned that removing vinyl lettering is not my favorite thing to do. Sally Boyd taped, kept my ladder steady and helped paint the wall. I could not have done it without her. Our new vinyl letters are now in place and the finish is in sight. I hope the new look invites people in.

Check the "Call to Artists" in this issue for Art Dollars for Scholars. The front page of our website has a link to the prospectus: https://villagegalleryarts.org Please participate and invite your friends to do so. It supports a good cause and should be a lot of fun, as well! In addition to this community-based show, Sharon Dunham has lined up a number of Outside Show opportunities for 2022. These shows provide more exposure and sales opportunities for member artists and also increase awareness of VGA in the community.

This year will present the Village Gallery with new challenges. The good news was that last month we signed a new five-year lease and also reapplied for our Washington County Property Tax Exemption, which we had previously lost. The board is optimistic that with our increased Community Service activities we will regain our exemption. Our quoted rental rate has been predicated on having this exemption (our status as a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization is not sufficient). If we are not granted the exemption, the property tax cost will be added to our rent on a monthly basis.

Another challenge is filling the Treasurer position on the Executive Board. If you have been reading your emails and previous newsletters, you are aware that the election slate is full except for this position, which will be vacant April 1st. Consider that as you ponder who writes the check when you teach a class or sell your art ... and sees that our bills are paid each month. Last fall, one of our members said something like, "Don't worry. It always works out." This is magical thinking. It only "works out" if someone steps up. If someone says, I can't do the entire job, but I can do "this part" of it, that's a start. Maybe someone else will step up and do the rest. Training is available. We are exploring contracting a bookkeeper, which means we will be paying for services, but we will still need a Treasurer to interface with the bookkeeper and the board, prepare reports, etc. If you can do at least part of the job, please reach out to an Executive Board member and let us know. Elections are in February and the clock is ticking.



Explore the possibilities of working with acrylics. This class will cover color theory, composition, layering and working with the unique properties of acrylics. It is appropriate for students with no painting experience or those with some experience looking for ideas, structure or to improve their skills. Each painting will provide a different instructional focus.

- Brushes—1/2" flat or filbert recommended. One smaller, plus one smaller round (#4 or #6)
- A cheap I" chipping/utility brush (suggested vendors: Harbor Freight or Home Depot)
- Palette—Can be a large plastic lid or styrofoam tray you would otherwise recycle
- Xacto knife
- An old toothbrush
- Masking tape
- Apron
- Optional: stencils, palette knives, a scraper or expired plastic gift card, small spray bottle, and any other favorite supplies you may have

I promise you will learn a lot, and it will be fun. I work hard to make sure my classes are fun while making certain that my students experience a great deal of growth during our time together. I love watercolor and I love teaching. I've spent years in Arizona and Oregon teaching this fun and exciting medium.

Introduction to Watercolor with Jean Anderson

Vaccinations and Face Masks Required

Dates: Thursdays - March 3, 10, 24 & 3 (no class 3/17)

This class is four weeks. Each class is geared to the beginning student. It is also for someone who has experience with watercolor but feels that they are struggling with the medium. Each week we will complete a different painting. Some will be whimsical or abstract and some will be realistic. You will be proud and amazed by the art you can make.

Class I-Playing with watercolors

This is a basic watercolor class that will give you the skills to produce interesting and fun cards, small paintings and to journal with watercolor. You will learn what supplies are needed, how to set up a palette, and basic mixing (because yellow plus blue does not always mean green). wThese skills either teach you how to doodle in watercolor just for yourself or they set the stage for your journey to become a watercolor artist doing large works.

Class 2 - Using masking fluid, tape etc.

Moving beyond the toothbrush splatter, when to use it, what colors to use and how to do it with a brush and not get paint on the ceiling.

Class 3- Working on depth and form

Class 4 - Color schemes

Warm and Cool colors and how to use them.

Supplies - If you do not have supplies, I will loan you some for the 1st class. I would prefer that you not go buy supplies without knowing what to buy. Buying cheap supplies will just frustrate you and waste money.

If you have paints, paper, etc. please bring them to the first class. You will need something to make notes on and a pen, a pencil, two water containers (old cottage cheese or jelly jars are wonderful), an old towel, micron pens if you have them, toilet paper or paper towels. Watercolor paper should be 140lb, Artists Grade Watercolor Paint and brushes (all are available at a discount from Merriartist). Optional-An old tooth brush.

Brushes - I will loan you an inexpensive brush that a national artist uses and introduced me to. I'll give you tips on how to purchase a brush. You will be able to purchase your brush if you want for less than \$3.

Skills - I'll walk you through the basics of the student versus artist grades of paint, manufacturers and how to store your paints. We'll touch on palettes, and I'll share my experiences, pros and cons. I'll suggest colors to purchase and how to set up your palette.

We will start by painting small flowers and leaves. If you like you can outline them with micron pens after class. This will teach the water to paint ratio that you need. We'll practice splatter during this class.

We will move on to learn a basic wash, variegated washes, lifting paint, layering for three dimensional forms, highlights and shadows as we paint a small painting.


