

Her paintings have been featured in exhibitions in galleries and cultural centers throughout the United States, including the Costello Childs Fine Art Gallery in Scottsdale, Arizona, Patricia Rovzar Gallery in Seattle, Pryor Fine Art in Atlanta, and Arthouse in Austin, Texas. She has been featured in several national arts publications including American Art Collector. She was selected by Southwest Art magazine as "Artist to Watch. 
The Village Gallery of Arts will feature an open show May 1-29.

Recording Secretary – Lucy Nonnenkamp




