- Free 6"X6" canvases to entrants 18 & under (option to purchase 10"X10" wood panel)
- Panels may be used as is or altered in any way
 the artist sees fit, but must fit within the
 10"X10" or 6"x6" frame of the substrate. May
 not stick out further than 4" from the wall. No
 frames may be added.
- 10"X10" wood substrates may serve as a base for a free-standing entry. The piece must sit on the panel & not extend over the edges, nor be taller than 10".
- Artists must use the substrates provided by the Village Gallery. Any media is acceptable and the work must be completely dry when submitted. Any ceramic entries must be fired.
- 10"X10" panels must be wired (taut) 3" from the top with D-rings. 6"X6" canvases need no wires. Please mark ↑on the back to indicate top.
- All work must be original and entirely the work of the exhibiting artist.
- All artwork must be for sale. VGA advertises affordable local art. Please keep this in mind when pricing your work. Artists must confirm price upon delivery. VGA will retain a 30% commission on all sales. Buyer receives sold art at time of purchase.
- All artists must submit an application form with entry. Any updates will be communicated via email.

Kerry Schroeder is a contemporary mixed-media artist. Her paintings are ethereal and abstract, yet rooted in the physical world, finding context, and carrying underlying narratives. Strong dualities such as light and dark, the form and the formless, the raw and refined, imply simultaneous existences and worlds integrated. The multi-layered works reveal remnants and themes of a journey and a search.





Using nature as a language, she interprets both personal and universal experiences and the many cycles such as life and death, renewal, change, rebirth, transformation, evolving, and devolving.

Forms, marks, and colors come and go through a larger, more expansive world, allowing the viewer to connect to something abstract, yet something very familiar.

Schroeder received her Bachelor of Fine Arts from Tulsa University, with an emphasis in Art History, and now works and lives in Portland, Oregon.

In collaboration with Washington County Open Studios, the Village Gallery of Arts has been offered space next spring for 20-25 two-dimensional pieces and a few spots for three-dimensional work at the Walters Center, April 4 – May 26, 2023. This beautiful and well-known venue is a great place to have your art seen by a large number of visitors.

You are eligible to apply if you are a member of Village Gallery and you live in Washington County. Entry is limited to **one piece per artist** and there is a **30% commission** on any sales. Artwork will be accepted on a first come-first served basis. If you have already responded to this opportunity by virtue of being part of Washington County Open Studios, there is no need to apply a second time.

All 2-D pieces must have a hanging wire (no saw tooth hangers). The curator reserves the right to reject any pieces of artwork. Reasons why a piece might be rejected include inappropriate subject matter for all ages or it is a 3-D piece with sharp edges and considered a safety hazard.

When I pick up my camera I seldom set out with a mission to capture one particular thing. Rather, I allow mysel to be drawn along by the unexpected delights of color, light and texture. Once I am drawn in by an image I wish to capture, I am lessurely in my approach; like having a conversation with an old friend I consider the "personality" of the scene and what is the essence of the mankshibity that only my eye. 




